These wetlands are of international importance and provide habitat for many amazing species from the Mandurah Dolphins to thousands of migratory shorebirds. Because of their beauty our wetlands are highly valued for recreational purposes and play a huge role in our lifestyle. Our amazing wetlands and the waterways that feed into them are often subject to illegal dumping or careless littering of rubbish. Clean Up Peel Waterways aims to target and remove litter across the catchment by combining the efforts of our community, working together to Clean Up Peel Waterways.

Closed Events:

Estuary Guardians

Activity: Estuary Guardians from John Tonkin College will clean along the Harvey Estuary starting from the South Side of the Dawesville Cut through to Park Ridge over two days.

Mandurah Volunteer Dolphin Rescuers

Activity: The group will be cleaning the Falcon foreshore area around Cox Bay between Novara Boat Ramp and Ward Point.

Mandurah Over 55s Kayak Club

Activity: Closed event for Mo55sKC members and pre-booked guests who paddle kayaks to collect rubbish from the adjacent estuary and island shorelines not readily accessible on foot. Volunteers with kayaks considering participation must prearrange involvement.

Wayward Wenches

Activity: Wayward Wenches are a group of kayakers who are passionate about keeping the waterways clean and will be cleaning up Soldiers Cove.

Friends of Harvey Dam First Causeway

Activity: A family group that frequents the Harvey Dam has organised a clean-up of the shoreline of their favourite gathering place collecting rubbish and debris from the terrain as they go. The meeting point is at Harvey Dam.

Peel-Harvey Catchment Council (PHCC)

Activity: PHCC will remove large-sized rubbish from Lake Mealup and surrounding reserves.

John Tonkin College Duke of Ed program

Activity: Volunteer students will canoe/kayak from boat ramp into Lake Goegrup then clean up. We will use data sheets as we sort the rubbish to provide data.

Mandurah Volunteer Marine Rescue Group

Activity: The group will perform the clean-up on the water around the Town foreshore, Mandurah Performing Arts Centre and Dolphin Marina Waterways.

Mandurah Cruises

Activity: Mandurah Cruises will bring local tourism businesses together to clean up our waterways via boat. The team will take a 25-seater vessel from Mandjar Bay to Mandurah Quay and stopping to pick up rubbish along the way in various wetland locations.

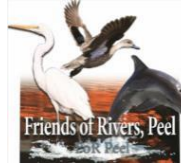
